Icebreaker Opening Question:

Who gave you your first Bible? How old were you, and do you still have it?

Asking for a friend: Is the Bible reliable?

1. What do you think is a non-Christian's view of the Bible? How does this differ from a Christian's view of the Bible?
2. Pastor Paul said, "The Word of God is not just language, but it is life giving!" Have you observed this? If so, how?
3. All people are on a search for the TRUE, GOOD and the BEAUTIFUL. What role does the Bible play in helping know and experience these things?
4. Satan deceived Eve in getting her to doubt the Word of God. What does this teach us about the nature of temptation? Furthermore, Jesus overcame temptation by consistently going back to Scripture. What does this teach us about overcoming temptation?
5. The make-up of the Bible is 66 books, 40 authors, 3 languages over 1,600 years with one central theme. Do you see this to be humanly possible? If not, then how did the Bible come together?
6. Over 24,000 of the earliest copies are within 125 years of the life of Christ. How does this give you confidence in the textual transmission of the Bible?
7. All religions have a reality of "faith" to them, but how does the Christian's view of the Bible retain an element of reasonable faith while it not being blind faith?
8. How has Scripture changed your life in the past, and how do you see the Bible different after today? Describe a day or season when God spoke to you deeply through the Word, and you have never forgotten it.
