*Icebreaker Opening Question:*

*If your life was made into a movie, what would the title of the movie be?*

**Asking for a friend: Is God anti-sex?**

1. Sex is a very important topic in the Bible. Why do you think the Church talks so little about it? And when the Church talks about sex, in what manner should it do so?
2. Why is the Bible so important when talking about the topic of sex? And what do we do if our sexual desires and wants are different than the Bible's teaching on the subject?
3. What do American culture and media say about God's nature and character? How is this affecting you?
4. Paul the Apostle in Ephesians 5:21-33 shows how the marriage relationship is a living illustration of Christ's love for his church. In what manner is this so? As a group go through the passage and make a list of how this is so.
5. Intimacy means "detailed knowledge." What is a basic teaching on covenant and why is it so important for intimacy with God and with another person? What are the ramifications of thinking one does not need a covenant to have knowledge of God?
6. What do you think the potential impact would be if the Church communicated clearly and consistently God's design for sex and sexuality? What would be the negative effects to our culture and next generation if we stay silent?
7. How does the Gospel (the truth that God makes all things new) give hope to those who have experienced or are experiencing a sense of sexual brokenness and pain?
8. The Song of Solomon was given to a worshiping community to remind them how God is to be pursued and how God is pursuing us. How does this change how we might have traditionally thought of God?
9. After today's message, do you see sexuality and spirituality differently? If so, how?
