- The vulnerable—children as well as others who are displaced, many living in makeshift refugee camps—where water and food are scarce, and for the teams serving them
- For those who serve in clinics and hospitals—for the emotional, spiritual, and physical stamina of the hospital staff who see many difficult cases and work in an often-chaotic environments
- Open hearts—for relational and supernatural encounters that will open doors of opportunity to share the gospel, both in word and deed
- The freedom of those bound by superstition, animistic traditions, or oppressive regimes; for those who are in situations of human trafficking and slavery—that all may know the freedom, love and grace of our Lord Jesus
- That we would live with the end in mind: the redeemed from all tribes, languages, and peoples worshipping the Living God!
