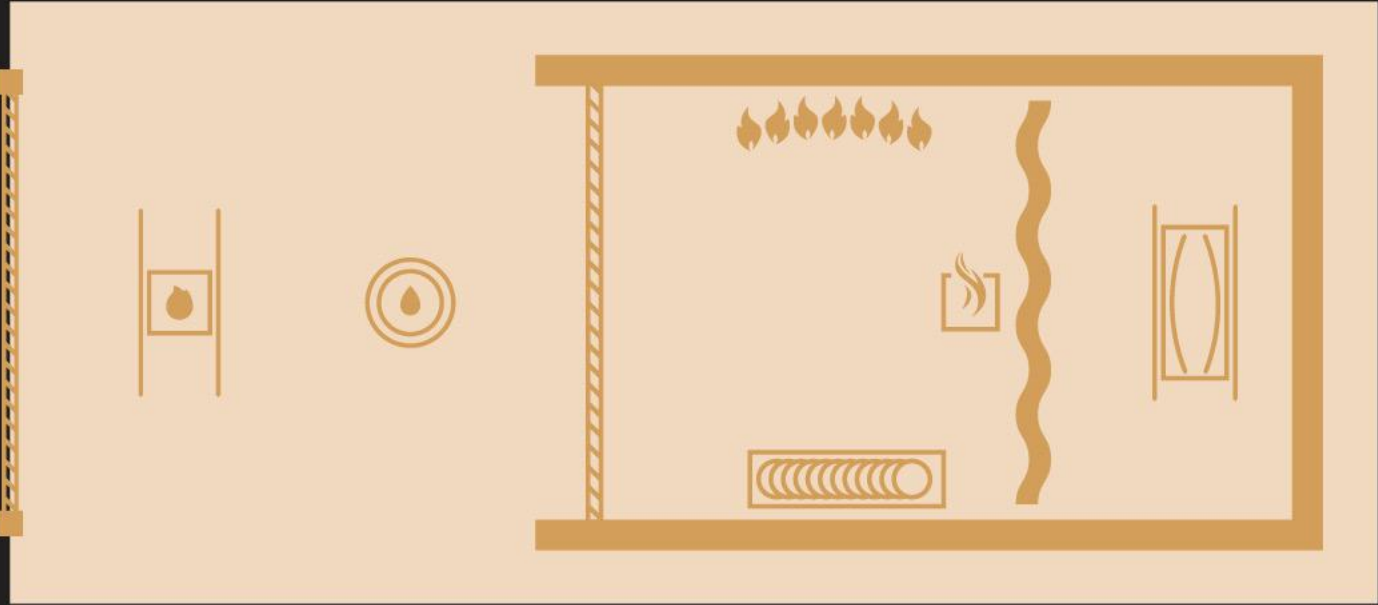
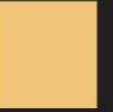


The Great High Priest

Leviticus 8–10

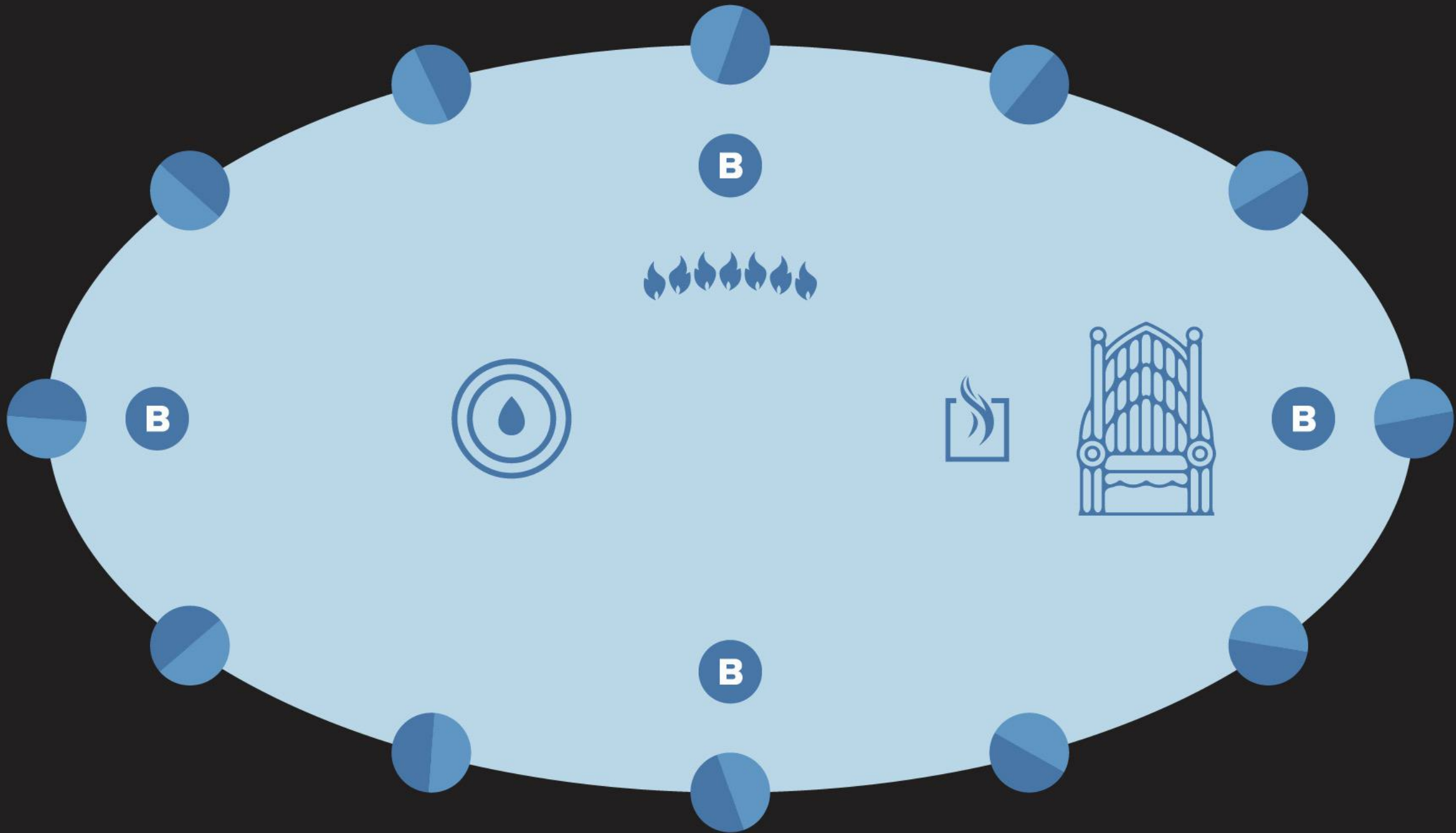




Hebrews 8:5 (NIV)

Leviticus 8:5–9 (NIV)

Moses said to the assembly, “This is what the LORD has commanded to be done.” Then Moses brought Aaron and his sons forward and washed them with water. He put the tunic on Aaron, tied the sash around him, clothed him with the robe and put the ephod on him.



Leviticus 8:5–9 (NIV)

He also fastened the ephod with a decorative waistband, which he tied around him. He placed the breastpiece on him and put the Urim and Thummim in the breastpiece. Then he placed the turban on Aaron's head and set the gold plate, the sacred emblem, on the front of it, as the LORD commanded Moses.

Leviticus 8:12–13 (NIV)

He poured some of the anointing oil on Aaron's head and anointed him to consecrate him. Then he brought Aaron's sons forward, put tunics on them, tied sashes around them and fastened caps on them, as the LORD commanded Moses.



Leviticus 8:23–24A (NIV)

Moses slaughtered the ram and took some of its blood and put it on the lobe of Aaron's right ear, on the thumb of his right hand and on the big toe of his right foot. Moses also brought Aaron's sons forward and put some of the blood on the lobes of their right ears, on the thumbs of their right hands and on the big toes of their right feet.



Leviticus 8:30C (NIV)

So he consecrated Aaron and his garments and his sons and their garments.



Leviticus 8:35B (NIV)

...do what the LORD requires, so you will not die; for that is what I have been commanded.



Leviticus 8:24A (NIV)

Fire came out from the presence of the LORD and consumed the burnt offering...



Leviticus 10:2 (NIV)

So fire came out from the presence of the LORD and consumed them, and they died before the LORD.



Hebrews 4:14–15 (NIV)

Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess.



Hebrews 4:14–15 (NIV)

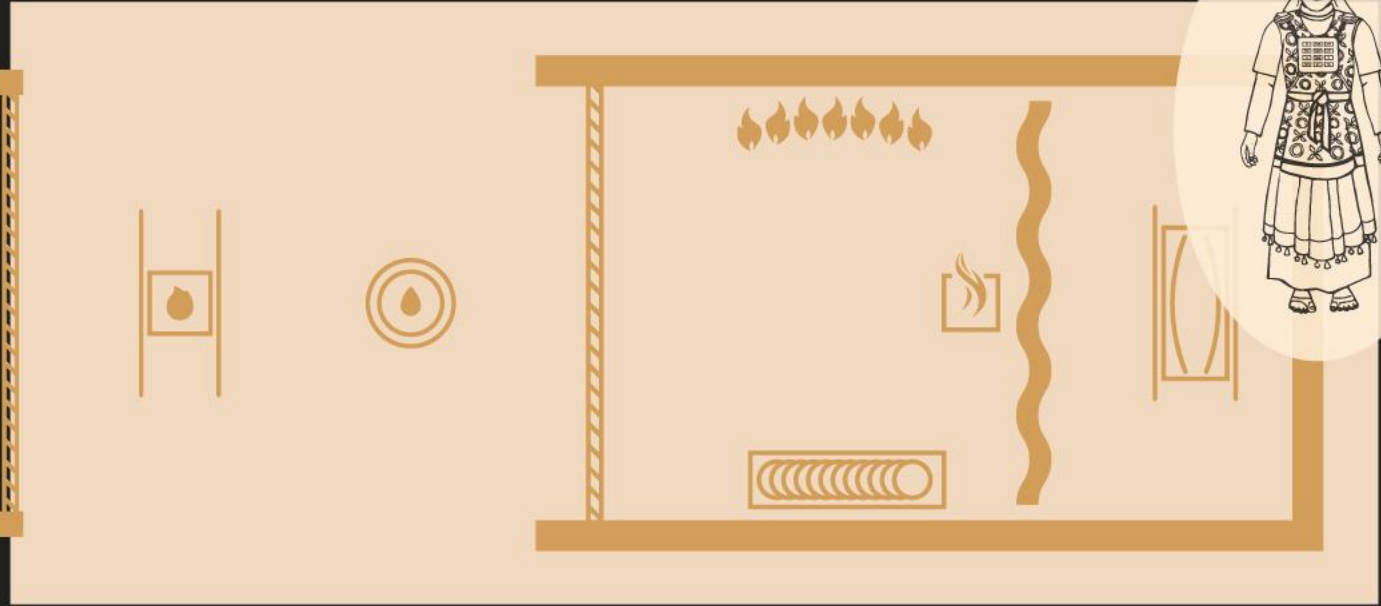
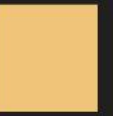
For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin.

Hebrews 10:11–14 (NIV)

But when this priest had offered for all time one sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, and since that time he waits for his enemies to be made his footstool. For by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy.
